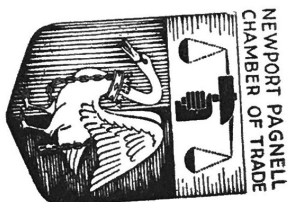

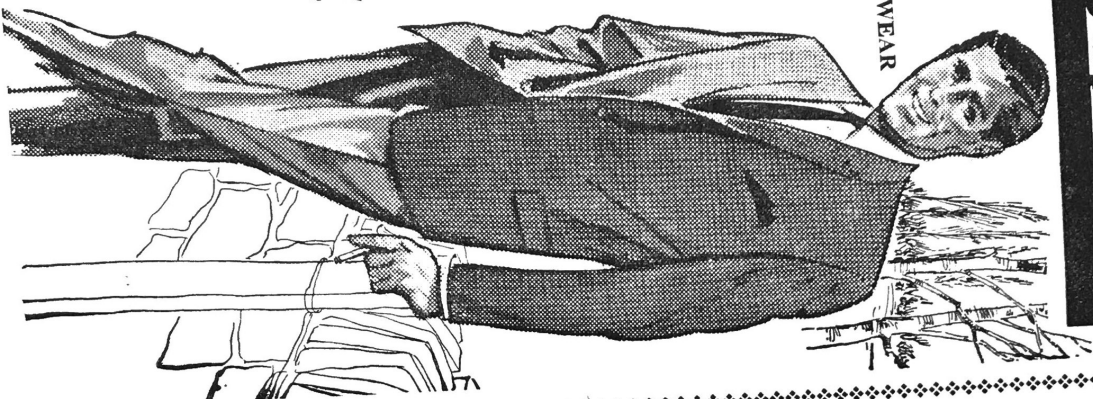

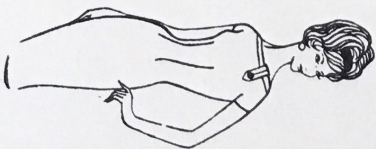

NEWPORT PAGNELL AND DISTRICT CHRISTIAN COUNCIL

Local Christian Councils have been working in some parts of the country for many years, and this Council was officially formed on 14th May, 1962. An executive committee comprised of local clergy, ministers and laymen from all churches officially affiliated to the British Council of Churches was appointed and has begun to forge links between the churches in the area of the Newport Pagnell Rural Deanery.

The first activity in the name of the Council was the organisation of the collections in the district for the "Bread for the World" campaign, in May, 1962. Plans for joining in the world-wide week of Prayer for Christian Unity 18th-25th January, 1963 are in hand. It is likely that there will be opportunities for Christians of all denominations to share with one another in services and in a united public meeting during that week.

The Newport Pagnell & District (incorporating the Co-operative) Youth Club

An account of the Co-operative Youth Club in last year's programme stated that they were "without a club room but were hoping that before the year was out something would be done about it."

Quite a lot has been done. In November the Club was reconstituted and renamed; and thanks to willing help from the U.D.C. were housed temporarily at the Swimming Pool buildings. Later permission was given by the County Council for the Club's use of the Ram Inn. The Youth Club members not only repaired and re-decorated it in time for its opening on 1st April, but also raised nearly £200 themselves to pay for it. Unfortunately, even the Ram is only a temporary home as the building is coming down for road widening. In any case with a Club membership of 200 and the many activities: Sporting, Serious and Social it is quite inadequate.

Plans for a new building have been made and an application has been made through the County Council for a grant. Even so the Youth of Newport Pagnell and District are faced with raising £4,000 locally. Perhaps before next Carnival time the building may have started.

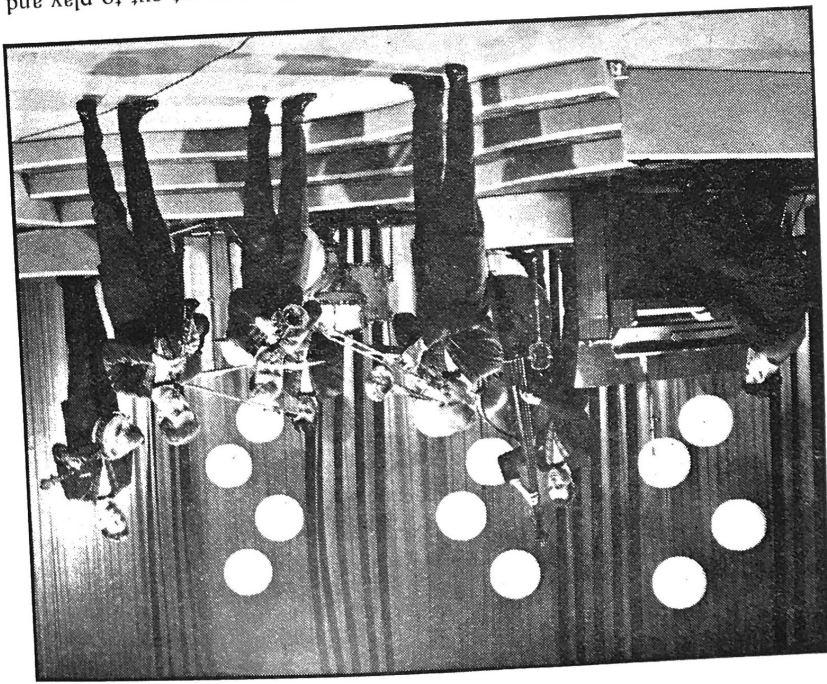

Swinging trad jazz is what the Clyde Valley Stompers set out to play and just how well they are succeeding can be seen by the continual flood of bookings which keep pouring in.

It's certainly no exaggeration to say that where the "Clydes" play, "House full" notices have become a commonplace thing.

The Band hails from Scotland and is proud of the fact that it is to-day not only the country's No. 1 trad band but also one of the bands most in demand in England.

It was the first British Jazz band to have the honour of being chosen for a Royal Variety Performance.

It played before the Queen and Duke of Edinburgh at the first Scottish Royal Variety Performance—which took place at Glasgow's Alhambra Theatre on July 3rd, 1958.

It has played concert dates with many top attractions.

These have included concerts with Louis Armstrong and his All Stars, the Kid Ory Band, Big Bill Broonzy, the Papa Bue Band, Sidney Bechet and the Temperance Seven.

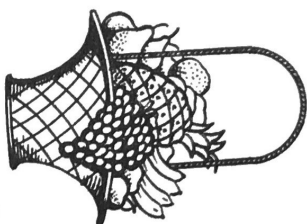

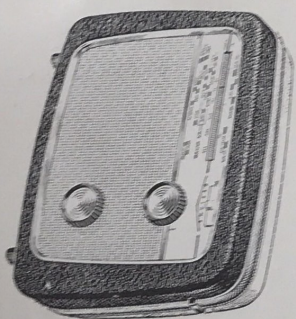
