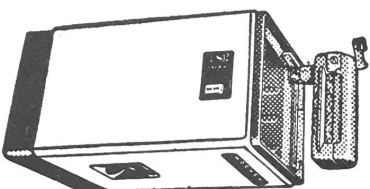
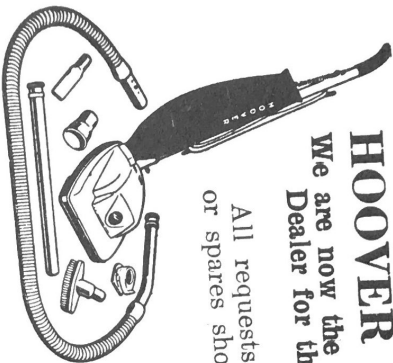

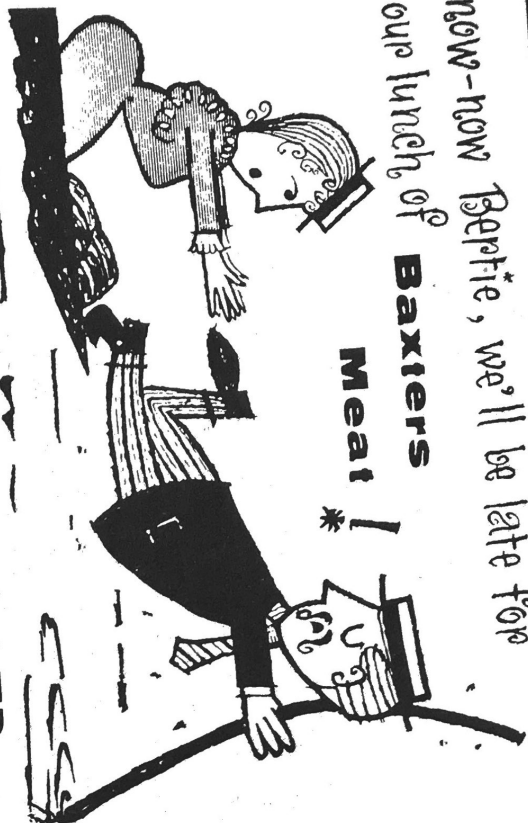

Riverside Motor Club Carnival Autocross

This is great entertainment both for the spectator and competitor. It could well be described as the Motorist's Gynkhana, being well laced with the same kind of sporting humour and novice dash.

The Competitors, one or two at a time, drive round a field circuit in the shortest possible time. The track is always fairly twisty and slippery, and often muddy and a little bumpy, consequently there is a lot of sliding about, revving and cussing, with bits of turt and mud all over the place.

Despite this, speeds are really quite low, and it is almost impossible to damage one's car. Although vehicles are divided into classes to make competition fairer, the family saloon often does well in the events. Sports cars have too much power for the slippery grass, and not enough weight to get a good grip.

So, if you would like some fun and excitement, bring your car — this is the day for you!
