

Newport Pagnell in the Civil War 1642-6

The considerable importance of Newport Pagnell during the Civil War was largely due to its geographical position. It dominated one of the main routes from London to the north and blocked the way from the King's head-quarters at Oxford to the eastern counties, which provided Parliament with men and money.

During the autumn of 1643 the Paliamentarians were planning to use the town as winter quarters for their main army, but before they could do so Prince Rupert marched on it with 6,000 men, and occupied it on the 16th of October. He then passed on to Bedford, leaving Sir Lewis Dyve in possession with about 2,000 infantry. Dyve immediately began to fortify the town, forcing the local people to dig defensive ditches, which were then filled with water from the surrounding rivers. A few days later a spy reported that the Royalists had 'fortifyed the towne at that side toward Bury Field, and are at work in several other places. They keep a strong guard on the (Ouse) bridge and a mile further out they have a horse guard'.

The Cavaliers could now not only threaten the eastern counties, but also block the London road, 'their drift being to intercept all Cattell and other provisions that shall come out of the adjacent counties to London . . . and so starve it, if they be not timely prevented and unrested out of this place.' Parliament acted swiftly, and within a week of the Royalist occupation seven regiments of the London Trained Bands were marching on Newport Pagnell to dislodge the Cavaliers. They were commanded by the Parliamentary commander-in-chief, the Earl of Essex, assisted by Major-General Skippon and Sir Samuel Luke, MP for Bedford.

The Royalist garrison were short of ammunition, but the King ordered Dyve to hold the town: his orders, however, were apparently misunderstood, and either because of this, or because his defences were incomplete, Sir Lewis withdrew the Royalists from the town on the night of the 26th October, 1643. Four days later, therefore, the Parliamentarians entered the town unopposed, and they in their turn began to fortify it, Prince Rupert was bitterly disappointed, and recorded in his diary that it was 'the mistake about Newport Pagnell which spoiled all.'

For the remainder of the war Newport Pagnell was garrisoned for Parliament, for the most part under the command of Sir Samuel Luke. The permanent garrison consisted of about 200 cavalry and 600 infantry, who were reinforced in times of danger by soldiers from the eastern counties. For most of the war, however, they were chronically short of money, food and ammunition. In charge of the fortifications was a Dutchman, Captain Cornelius Vandenboome, who also commanded a company armed with the

latest flint lock muskets.

cavalry surprised and routed an enemy rorce at 1811p.

On many other occasions Luke's men drove off Royalists raiding or plundering parties, though the town was never attacked in force. After the King's defeat at Naseby (Leics.) in June 1845 Newport Pagnell ceased to be of such strategic importance, but it continued to be garrisoned until after the fall of Oxford in 1846.
